


Advice for HGV drivers on avoiding Norton St Philip, Near Bath, Somerset

There is a **7.5t** weight limit (traffic regulation order) on the **A366** from the **A362** to the west, (Frome to Radstock road) through **Norton St Philip** to the **A36** and also from the **A36** to the junction with the **b3109** (at Wingfield to the east).

The limit also covers the **B3110** (north) from the **A36** (Woolverton) through the village and on towards **Hinton Charterhouse** and **Bath**. These roads are shown in **red** below so **please avoid them.**

The weight limits permits "loading/unloading" but **only** if this takes place **within** the traffic regulation order (ie Norton St Philip, Faulkland, Hinton Charterhouse or Midford).

<u>These roads must not be used as a through route</u> or to load or unload in Radstock, Midsomer Norton, Buckland Dinham or Mells.



The centre of the village is covered by cctv operating 24/7 and the Police are now carrying out patrols along these routes. Transgressing drivers will face fines.

A number of HGVs over 7.5 tons have already been stopped and the drivers now face fines of up to £250 and 3 penalty points on their licences. Repeat offenders can face further fines and penalties. Employers can be fined up to £1,000 per breach with the risk of sanctions against their operator's licence by the Traffic Commissioner.
